Goal: Meet your students halfway by using clear speaking strategies.

(1) Clear Speaking

Student Challenges	 Inability to understand parts of lectures Listening exhaustion Unwillingness to ask for clarification
Instructor Strategies	 ✓ Slow down ✓ Give students time to process ✓ Recognize challenge of reduced forms ("woodja") & intonation subtleties ✓ Organize (previews, transitions, summaries, repeated patterns, varied activities) ✓ Check understanding (anonymous posts, mini quizzes, pair/group reviews) ✓ Avoid "Do you understand?" and 'trap' questions ("So you think?")

(2) Vocabulary & Grammar

Student Challenges	 Technical vocabulary Idioms, phrasal verbs, slang/jargon Complex grammar Assumed cultural knowledge Humour (especially irony & sarcasm) Acronyms
Instructor Strategies	 Vocabulary ✓ Monitor vocabulary level (pause to define/ paraphrase essential words) ✓ Use the same terms consistently ✓ Compile "living" glossary with practice site(s) ✓ Monitor cultural references (explain valuable ones – good teachable moments!) ✓ Build in comprehension checks (anonymous posts, mini quizzes, pair/group reviews) ✓ Avoid "Do you understand?" and 'trap' questions (So you think?")

- Be yourself! Your students enjoy your style. Recognize they're also learning the language of the discipline from you.
- > Control your pace and monitor your language.
- Don't dumb down your lectures: use necessary terms but pause to define/explain them as necessary
- > Be organized, vary activities, and replicate info in other forms (and D2L).
